


Died: 1321 in Ravenna soon after finishing "Paradise," the last book of "The Divine Comedy."








1274: Dante first meets and falls in love with Beatrice Portinari

Died: 1321
Ravenna after falling ill on return from Venice where he had been sent as an ambassador




- 1300 for 2 months Dante is one of the 6 highest magistrates in Florence
- 1301 Dante is sent to Rome as an envoy to Pope Boniface VIII
- 1302 The Black Guelfs seize power in Florence and Dante is banished, condemned to be burned alive if taken in the territory of the Florentine Republic


Below: Actual tomb of Dante in Ravenna


