5. Be able to summarize the *story* of the Bible in a couple of paragraphs building on the following events listed below in alphabetical — not chronological — order. You are not limited to these events or people. However, please note that your story must be told chronologically and that it must be a story rather than a simple listing of the events.

Abraham's call, Babylonian exile, birth of Jesus, building of Temple, burning of Temple, coming of Holy Spirit at Pentecost, conquest and re-settlement of Canaan, creation, death and resurrection of Jesus, division of kingdom, establishment of monarchy, Exodus, Fall, John's final vision, missionary journeys of Paul, period of Judges, promise of a redeemer, slavery in Egypt.
